MRH WEEKEND REVIEW

CHIRINGITA - 4TH - PAKENHAM BM66 1400M

Well-fancied import Chiringita made her long-awaited Australian debut at Pakenham on Thursday night, finishing fourth after attracting strong market support. Sent off at a short quote, the mare was resuming from a seven-month break that included an overseas campaign and travel, factors that may have told late in the run. Kent Jnr expects her to take natural improvement from the outing, with a second-up target on a softer surface likely to suit her better.

CENTENARIO - 1ST - CANTERBURY BM78 1900M

Centenario returned to winning form on Friday night, producing a dominant display over 1900 metres to claim an impressive victory. The Waterhouse & Bott stable appears to have the son of Contributor back to his best after some time out in the paddock. Now rated 72, Centenario remains well placed to progress through the grades, with a step up to 2000 metres and beyond expected to suit as his campaign continues.

APOCALYPTIC - 2ND - RANDWICK GROUP 2 1200M

Star filly Apocalyptic resumed in the Light Fingers Stakes (G2, 1200m) and finished a close second after being denied by a tactically perfect ride from Nash Rawiller aboard Savvy Hallie. Rawiller controlled the tempo from the front in a slowly run affair, leaving Apocalyptic with ground to make up late as she worked home strongly but was unable to reel in the leader.

Jockey Tommy Berry expects the filly to take significant improvement from the first-up run and Michael Freedman confirmed she would press on to the Surround Stakes (G1), where she is set to meet fellow emerging fillies Tempted and Ole Dancer. With a more genuinely run race anticipated, there is optimism that Apocalyptic can turn the tables on the 28th..

STORM LEOPARD - 1ST - BALLARAT BM66 1600M

Storm Leopard was the standout winner of the weekend, easing down to score by 2.5 lengths over the mile in a comfortable victory at Ballarat. While the opposition was modest, the manner of the win was very impressive, with the gelding relishing the step up in distance to the mile for the first time. Whilst he would appreciate another rise in trip, the team at Lindsay Park are eyeing off the VOBIS Platinum Guineas for him on March 14th, worth \$500,000 over 1600m for VOBIS qualified horses only, which looks like a great race for him.
